YEAR 5 LEARNING OVERVIEW Mayhem

TERMS 5 and 6 Morals, Manners and

Reading

Reading will continue to take place daily in Terms 5 and 6. Three sessions a week will be dedicated to fluency and comprehension and two sessions a week will create opportunities for children to practise developing their comprehension skills. Please continue to read at home daily and add this to Boom Reader.

Writing

Our writing will be based around an exciting variety of texts and will include instruction writing, narrative poetry, writing a biography and a diary entry. We will focus on presentation as well as accurate use of grammar and punctuation. We will continue to work on the use of paragraphs. Please utilise the Emile App at home to consolidate spelling knowledge.

Mathematics

In maths, we will be developing our and statistical geometrical knowledge and skills. We then move on to developing our skills in applying the four operations with decimal numbers. We will be continuing to practice our fluency skills and will spend time reinforcing times table skills.

Science

In science, we will be learning about forces and human body. The children will learn about different types of forces and conduct experiments to investigate the effects of a force. They will also learn about the life cycle of humans, including adolescence and puberty, observing growth in humans and animals.

VICTORIAN HOUSE MAID



The children will study life in Victorian England and learn about Queen Victoria's reign. Children will make comparisons between life in modern England and life in the Victorian Era and understand where this period fits on a timeline. They will learn about The The Great British Empire. Exhibition and The Industrial Revolution.

Geography

The children will learn about the geography of South America. They will learn about past civilisations and empires. Children will also have an opportunity to learn about the Amazon Rainforest, the Andes mountain range, the Atacama Desert and Brazilian agriculture and industry.

Art & DT

Children will be looking at the work of William Morris. They will learn the techniques of designing and printing patterns in the style of textile printing. In DT, we will be learning the skills of making a victorian toy that moves up and down using a cams mechanism. Children will have an opportunity to research and investigate different materials followed by designing and making their toy.

The children will be learning key skills associated with cricket and athletics with the Brighton and Hove PE coaches. The children will also be learning rounders skills this term. Full PE kits should be worn on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Please ensure children have a water bottle during the warmer weather.

The children will continue to develop their knowledge of French They will learn to talk about their family-relations, names and ages as part of a French conversation. They will also learn about their classroom and surroundings in French this term.

PSHE & Computing

RE

Music
