




<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To demonstrate understanding of a story they've heard</li><li>• To be able to anticipate and predict during story time</li><li>• To use new vocabulary in the correct context</li><li>• To blend words consistently</li><li>• To read aloud a simple sentence using their phonics knowledge</li><li>• To read common exception words (tricky words)</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To write recognisable letters following the RWI rhymes</li><li>• To spell words by identifying the sounds in them and representing the sounds with a letter or letters</li><li>• To match lowercase and capital letters</li><li>• To write a simple sentence that can be read by others</li><li>• To use a capital letter</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To have a deep understanding of number to 10</li><li>• To know number bond facts to 10</li><li>• To add and subtract single digit numbers</li><li>• To order numbers to 10</li><li>• To know some teen numbers</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To be able to double and halve</li><li>• To recognise even and odd numbers</li><li>• To verbally count beyond 20</li><li>• To compare quantities, recognising when one quantity is greater than, less then or the same as the other quantity.</li></ul>
