



In Science, we will be looking at the heart and the circulatory system including the functions and importance of the heart. We aim to encourage the children to question, formulate ideas and test them in practical work throughout our topic.





History

In history, we will learn all about

also learn about how religion

was changed during the reign of

the Tudor family and how this

impacted life during this time.

We will learn to draw maps with increasing complexity using scale measures. We will focus on using OS symbols and keys to make our own 'Fantasy 'maps. In our final term, we will be bringing together all of the skills we have developed throughout KS2.

Geography

In DT, we look closely at the heart and create our own 3D models using a wide range of media and IT. In Art, the children will be learning new printing techniques and building upon those they already have. They will be making their own tiles and using different oils

and paints in the printing process.
