


### Year 4

## SEN TEAM information

As you may know, we have a new Inclusion Team working across The Parkland Federation. **Miss Jewell** is our new SENCO. She has worked at Parkland Infant School since 2017 as a class teacher and as the KS1 Phase Leader. Previous to this, Miss Jewell taught in Hastings, Bexhill and also in America! Miss Jewell has a Masters degree (MA) in Special Needs and Inclusion and is currently studying for the National Award in SEN Coordination. **Mrs Moran** joined us in 2020 from the Local Authority where she worked for 3 years in the iSEND department. Working alongside our fantastic SEN Team, we also have a highly skilled Pastoral Support Team led by Mrs Das, who is the Assistant Head of Schools. Mrs Das is a qualified Drawing and Talking Therapist and leads a team which includes Art Therapy, a Play Therapist, a School Counsellor, Animal Therapists and a Family Liaison Officer. She also works closely with the NHS Mental Health Team. We have an Emotional Literacy Specialist and several Thrive Practitioners across both schools too.

### MEMORIAL NEWS

As many of you will know, we tragically lost one of our treasured pupils, Julianna, over the summer. Whilst staff have been working hard to support her classmates and also each other, they have also been thinking about a memorial that would be a fitting tribute to her. We have decided to create a beautiful secret garden in Julianna's memory that will include an abundance of colourful flowers and trees as well as an engraved bench. It will be somewhere beautiful that teachers can enjoy with small groups of children who will use the area for outdoor learning. # 100% PERFECTION

#### 96%+ VERY GOOD

At this level, you give yourself the best chance of achieving your potential.

96% equals 7.5 days absence in a year.

#### 93% - 95.9% COULD BE BETTER

95% means a half-day missed every 2 weeks. In a year, that's 43 lessons to catch up on.

#### 90.1% - 92.9% IMPROVEMENT REQUIRED

92% equals 3 weeks of lost learning every year. Between Y7 and Y11, this means 15 weeks lost in total.

#### 90% and below PERSISTENTLY ABSENT

At 90%, you have missed almost 100 lessons in a year. Attendance at 90% each year means that by Y11, you will have missed out













#### Attendance Matters

Did you know that just 17 days absence from school a year could mean a drop in a GCSE grade in all subjects? It is critical that all children attend school if they are well enough to do so. Miss McCaffery is our Attendance Officer and analyses attendance figures daily. If your child's attendance becomes a concern, we will contact you to offer support in order to make sure we get this back on track as soon as possible. This will help prevent any gaps in learning increasing. If you have any questions about attendance, please do not hesitate to contact the school office.


















## Science Update

## FAMILY LIAISON OFFICER

Our Family Liaison Officer (Dawn Wingett) currently has a limited number of spaces available. She can offer advice and guidance to parents and carers in areas such as:

- ★ Listening and talking to children and parents about any concerns or queries they have within the family or school.
- Promoting conversations between parents and their children through family mediation.
- Attending meetings with you, for moral support or to take notes.
- Helping complete forms/paperwork.

According to the Roblox website, 'Roblox is the world's largest interactive social platform for play'. For those of you not so familiar with the game, it is a multi-player online gaming platform which allows children to play and create a variety of games in a 3D world. Roblox is free to play and available on all modern smartphones, tablets, desktops, Xbox One, Oculus Rift, and HTC Vive.











# What parents need to know about BBBBBBBBBB



#### ROBLOX STUDIO

The Roblox Studio allows users to create their own games and 'worlds' for others to play on the platform. As the games are user generated, it gives users the freedom to potentially include things you do not want your child to be exposed to, for example, weapons, violence and even pornographic content. There are no age restrictions on the games created in the Roblox Studio and Roblox can only rely on people reporting negative/violent content in order to remove the games from the platform.

## CHATTING AND FRIEND REQUESTS

Whilst the games in Roblox are aimed at 8 to 18-year-olds, there are currently no age restrictions for signing up. This means both adults and young people can play and communicate with each other and send friend requests through the platform. Once a friend request is accepted, this means that they can communicate with each other outside of gameplay.

#### ROBUX ONLINE PAYMENTS n a user creates a game, the

When a user creates a game, they earn something called 'Robux', which works as a currency within the platform, allowing the purchase of upgrades and memberships. If the created game is of good quality and attracts multiple players and in-game adverts, children have the potential to earn a lot of 'Robux'. Once a user has earned a certain amount of Robux, they can convert this to real cash and withdraw it to a PayPal account. To withdraw money, users need to be over 13, have a PayPal account and have paid for the Roblox premium subscription.



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# Top Tips For Parents



#### **UNLIST SOCIAL MEDIA ACCOUNTS**

Make sure your child's social media accounts are not listed in the settings/account info. If they are, advise them to make them private or remove them in their account. This will ensure nobody can find and contact them on their social media platforms outside of Roblox.

#### **CHECK SHARED INFORMATION**

In the account settings, check that your child is not giving away any personal information in their bio/profile. For example, their full name, phone number or snapchaf name. If you see that they have, explain why this is potentially dangerous and remove immediately.

#### **2 STEP VERIFICATION**

Roblox has a great 2-step verification security feature which we recommend you enable to add an extra layer of security to your child's account.

#### **IS YOUR CHILD UNDER 13?**

Unfortunately, there are hundreds of YouTube videos showing children how to change their age settings on Roblox, so firstly, you should talk to your child to set up some rules/an agreement. There are additional safety features for children under 13, for example having their posts and chats filtered for inappropriate content and behaviour, so It is worth checking that your child has set up their account with the correct age. You can find this in their account settings.

#### **DISABLE IN-GAME CHAT**

Roblox is great for children to play together and chat to each other. However, If you wanted to completely turn off in-game chat for your child (meaning they could not contact anyone including their triends) you can do so by following these steps: When logged in, go to the Account Settings page by clicking on the gear icon at the top right corner of the page, then click Settings. Next, click on the Privacy tab and under 'Who can chat with me in game?' select 'No one' and this will disable ingame chat.



#### HAVE A CHAT ABOUT 'GRIEFING'

Griefing is when someone purposely upsels another player in a game. This can be done by setting traps, damaging or stealing something from another player, intentionally killing them and just generally doing something in the game to spoil gameplay for them. Essentially, 'Griefing' is a form of cyberbullying and can be extremely frustrating and upsetting for players.

#### **RESTRICT PAYMENT METHODS**

Roblox is a free to play game, but there are still options to make additional in-game purchases. If you do not want your child to make payments, ensure your card is not associated with their account. If you are happy for your child to make payments in the game, but want to limit spending, we suggest using a games console gift card. These can be purchased in specific amounts, which will allow you to limit how much your child spends and removes the need for a credit/debit card to be used with their account.
